KLM Royal Dutch Airlines and Air Mauritius will suspend their Joint Venture operations

KLM and Air Mauritius will suspend their joint venture operations between Mauritius and Amsterdam at the start of the 2019 IATA Winter season effective from 27 October 2019.

The current joint operations on the 2 weekly Air Mauritius' operated flights will continue throughout IATA Summer 2019 season ending on 26 October 2019.

Passengers holding tickets beyond this date will be either rebooked to other flights or are eligible for a refund.

The long established joint venture between Air France and Air Mauritius will not be affected by the suspension of the Amsterdam - Mauritius route, thus providing guests the option to travel via Paris Charles de Gaulle airport to Mauritius where both carriers will continue their operations with up to twice daily flights between Paris and Mauritius.

Air Mauritius is the national carrier of the Republic of Mauritius. Created in 1967, it currently operates a fleet of two A350-900, three A340-300, two A330-200, two A319-100 and three ATR72-500.
